CHAGGA HISTORICAL HIKE & WATERFALLS

A Visit to the Chagga Museum, Waterfalls, Kibo Hotel & the Old Chagga Caves

The Chagga (or Wachagga) are Bantu-speaking indigenous tribe and the third largest ethnic group in Tanzania. They traditionally live on the southern and eastern slopes of Mount Kilimanjaro and Mount Meru near Moshi.

DETAILED ITINERARY

After Breakfast you leave for Marangu Village. You stop at the Chagga Museum giving you a brief historical tour of the Chagga tribe.

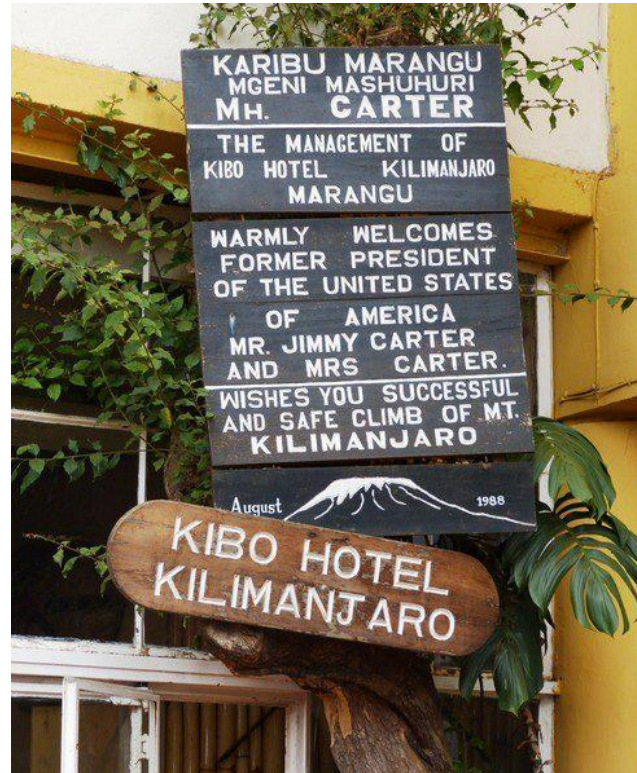


Followed by a hike to the waterfalls a unique excursion that will take you through the rich rain forest



You stop for lunch at The Kibo hotel, well over 100 years old, is where Hans Meyer stayed overnight before starting his famous first ascent of Kilimanjaro.

Another prominent guest in more recent times was Former President of the United States of America Mr Jimmy Carter.



After lunch you trek to practically explore historical caves reaching several kilometres, appreciate the architectural designs of the caves and listen to stories on how they were effective as hiding tunnels with many secret chambers in it which the Chagga people and their cattle used as hiding places during inter-tribal wars.



You will get the full story of this inter-tribal war and the caves from our experienced guide.

Because of the high altitude of this village the tour gives you an opportunity to acclimatise but also have fun as you learn about other cultures.
